My over- sized childhood Christmas shoe.

I have so many childhood Christmas stories and recently, I started reminiscing on these stories as Christmas approaches because they remind me of our special place in the Christmas story. Christmas is about Jesus Christ, however, without us, there will be no Christmas. It is the love that God has for us as his children that made Christmas happen and our parents reflect that love at Christmas. Many parents and grandparents will go bankrupt this week as they try to get the special gifts that their child deserves. As a child, special clothes and shoes were bought for us only once in a year, that is, at Christmas. Then, we were materially poor but Christmas is never Christmas without Christmas clothes and shoes in Nigeria. My mother was a legend! She never took us to the shops to buy our Christmas shoes. She would tell us to line up and she will pick a stick broom and measure the length of our legs. With vigilant eyes, we ensured that she got the correct measurement of our size. She woould take the measurements and go to the market alone. Never with us! However, and tragically, the shoes she bought were always oversized, though shiny. We would cry foul play, but my poor Mum had ensured that the shoes would last up to one year with our fast-growing bodies. Often, the inner part of the shoes was filled with papers to ensure that it fitted. Our childhood Christmas was never complete without our fake designer glasses, fake Rolex and our oversized Christmas clothes made with the same material and style for all my siblings. Christmas reminds me of how special I am to my family and I miss this aspect of Christmas so much. In the Gospel reading, Jesus reminds us that we are so special and important to him. He even said that the least among us is more important than John the Baptist, who is his relation and a prophet. No matter your situation this Christmas, remember that God loves you so much and that you are valued and important to him.
