His Own Received Him not!

As we continue celebrating Christmas, we reflect on more readings that give us another deeper explanation of Jesus' birth. Today's gospel text is the same as on Christmas day but it is surprising that St. John's narrative has nothing like a baby, mother, shepherds and others. He instead talks about a "Word" that was with God and through which all things came to be. In the creation story God was using a word to command the creation of things (Gen 1:3-6). It is that "creating word" that became flesh and dwelt among us – the incarnation of Jesus according to St. John (Jn 1:14). John uses several themes to deeply explain the incarnation; these include life, light, darkness, sin, witness, glory and universality. The incarnation brought back life and light to humanity that was struggling in the darkness of sin. However, John notes a striking human tragedy, "He [Jesus] came to his own but his own people received him not" (Jn 1:11). A story is told of a community of European priests who used to commute to a convent of European nuns to lead them in mass. One day the priests were visited by an African priest whom they requested to help them with mass at the convent since they were going somewhere else. On arrival at the convent, the nun who opened the door was surprised to see another of those people who always come asking for help. "Sorry, we can't help you now. We are about to have mass, come some other time," she quickly dismissed him. The priest thanked her and left. A few minutes later the nuns were ringing the bells wondering the cause of the delay for mass only to learn that the priest had come and they turned him away! How have I welcomed the newly-born saviour, source of life and light?

Entrance Antiphon: Wis 18: 14-15

When a profound silence covered all things and night was in the middle of its course, your all-powerful Word, O Lord, bounded from heaven's royal throne.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints.

Gospel John 1:1-5, 9-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of

the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the Only Begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.
