A Call from Darkness to Light

After thirty years with the family in Nazareth, the time came for Jesus to start his public ministry. With John the Baptist's arrest (Mt 4:12-13), Jesus saw that the renewal movement John had started needed a leader, and he was the most suited for the duty. He continued with John's gospel of repentance, for the kingdom was close at hand. Some of John disciples were the first to follow Jesus, and then he started calling his own. He first got two pairs of brothers, that is Peter and Andrew, plus the sons of Zebedee, James and John. They were all fishermen, and he transformed them into fishers of men. They left everything (boats, nets and their parents) and followed him at once. Reflecting on the call of these first disciples, Pope Francis shared, "There are different ways of carrying out the plan that God has for each of us, which is always a plan of love... And the greatest joy for every believer is to respond to this call, to offer all at the service of God and their brethren." At our baptism, we accepted Jesus's, call and shared in his priestly and prophetic ministry. As a fisher of men, how often have I shared God's word to win souls for Christ? Even when I don't use words, how exemplary is my life of witness to draw people to the saviour (Mt 5:13-16)? Those who were called, immediately left their belongings and parents and followed Jesus. How easy is it to separate myself from my dark life and other attachments so as to embrace Christ and his light? When am I to denounce the fraudulent business dealings, insincerity, injustice, laziness in my prayer and sacramental life? The day to heed to the Lord's call is today, just like Peter, Andrew, James and John. Let us cast off our life of darkness and embrace Christ's light.

TODAY'S READINGS

Second reading 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgement. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarrelling among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each one of you says, 'I follow Paul', or 'I follow Apollos', or 'I follow Cephas', or 'I follow Christ.' Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise but to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

Gospel Acclamation Cf. Matthew 4:23

Alleluia, alleluia. Jesus proclaimed the gospel of the kingdom and healed every affliction among the people. Alleluia.

Gospel Matthew 4:12-23

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee. And leaving Nazareth he went and lived in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: 'The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles — the people dwelling in darkness have seen a great light, and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned.' From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him. And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people.

Priest: The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

THE NICENE CREED:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one

Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. **Amen**
