



THE BEATITUDES: Our Road to Glory

Today's gospel text is part of the first sermon of Jesus and Matthew which presents him as the new Moses. In the Old testament, Moses went up to mount Sinai to receive the ten commandments, (Ex 19) whereas in the New testament, Jesus also goes to the top of a mountain, but sits down (Mt 5:1ff) to give the people guidelines by his preaching. When Jesus sits down, it is symbolic of his authority as God. He spells out eight Beatitudes (formulas for lasting happiness) which some scholars see as a new version of the ten commandments. They are not commandments, but deep-down attitudes of mind, inspired by a genuine love of God and others. These Beatitudes can then be seen as constituting the road map to attain happiness of the Kingdom of God. The poor in spirit is a formula for detachment from worldly riches. Those who mourn, are comforted with the joy of being detached from pleasure-seeking attitudes. The meek renounce power and violence by desiring no praise or front positions. The persecuted are blessed because they suffer for the sake of the good (righteousness) which ultimately triumphs over evil. The merciful demonstrate deep down compassion and empathy towards those in trouble. The Beatitudes help us to look for happiness in the right places. Where do I look for happiness? Do I live my life according to the values of the world for worldly happiness, or live by the teachings of Jesus?
