What is my Rightful Position?

After celebrating the Baptism of the Lord last Sunday, we enter Ordinary time. It is a time of growth, hope and life that is symbolised by green vestments. The season will give us several themes that enable us to grow in our love and service to God. Today's readings are mainly introductory. In the gospel, John the Baptist is introducing Jesus to the people when he points him out as the "Lamb of God." John, as a precursor of Jesus, was a powerful prophet who attracted a great following together with his disciples. However, he never pretended that he was the Messiah. He remained faithful to his call as one who prepares the way. He pointed out Jesus when he declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29-30). After this, two of his disciples left him and followed Jesus (Jn 1:37). John's attitude to Jesus remained, "He must increase, but I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). John accepts his position as number two yet, Jesus praises him for being the greatest of all human beings born of women! John challenges our view of envy and jealousy which rob us of our inner peace as we devise ways of eliminating the person we perceive as standing in our way to personal fulfillment. How do I feel about the greatness of another person? How faithful can I be in keeping another person's position? Do I willingly vacate an office when its rightful occupant comes? It's the same with property put in our custody until the rightful owner surfaces or becomes of age. Do I find it easy to surrender everything even if the rightful owner doesn't have the details? In line with John's person, life and ministry, let us be satisfied with who we are and what we have.

And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God.'

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. **Amen**
