Is my RICE still Relevant?

When I recall my catechism classes on Baptism, I often found myself wondering, why did Jesus need to be Baptised? We were taught that Baptism is the sacrament that washes away original sin and makes us children of God and members of the Church. Yet Jesus, being fully God, had no original sin. He was already the Son of God, and the Church itself would come into being after him. So why, then, did Jesus choose to be Baptised? (I will wait for your responses). In one community, a big celebration like Christmas was always marked by having rice and beef for the celebration meal. The day of Baptism was also a great celebration for Catholics. The newly Baptised would be dressed in snow-white garments, symbolising purity and new life in Christ. In many families, girls came to call these garments “the Rice Dress,” meaning the dress worn on the day they ate rice — a simple phrase that captures the joy, significance, and cherished memory of that sacred day. The catechist decided to use the same word **RICE** for instructing parents about the main components of baptism. R stands for **re-birth**. In baptism we are born again into a family of believers. We are even given another name to identify us in that family. I stands for **initiation**. Baptism initiates us into full membership of this new family called the Church. All members of this family pray collectively to God by addressing him, “Our Father”. C stands for **consecration**. Baptism makes us holy through the washing away of the original sin. Jesus refers to this by, “For the Lord has anointed (consecrated) me” (Lk 4:18). E stands for **empowerment**. Whoever receives this sacrament receives the power of the Holy Spirit to be a witness of Christ (Act 1:8) and lead others to the church to become disciples of Christ (Mt 28:19). The celebration of the Lord’s baptism reminds us of our own baptism and challenges us to review our membership, consecration and empowerment. Is my baptism still alive and relevant? Has it led anyone to Jesus and his church?

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. **Amen**

Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**
