SALT AND LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Today's Gospel gives us two images from ordinary life; salt and light. We are so used to salt that we may take it for granted, until it is lacking in food. We then recognise how tasteless food is! In the Old Testament times, it was used to preserve food (Lev 2:13), as a disinfectant for infants (Ezk 16:4), and for sealing covenants (II Chr 13). It is still used as a medicine on wounds in ordinary life. Today, Jesus is calling on Christians to be as valuable to the world as salt; to give it a taste, to preserve it, and heal it. Concerning the image of light, it is valuable in showing us the way. In the Old Testament, God led his people through the desert by using a pillar of fire (for light) at night (Ex 15:21-22). Scripture also uses it to symbolise a person's joy, energy and success (Prov 13:9). So, light is powerful in making things clearer, stronger and joyful. Therefore, with salt and light the world becomes a safe and good place to live in. Also, we should remember that both salt and light operate by associating with the thing that they want to change. Thus we must get involved in the various aspects of society. Are there elderly, lonely and sick people in my neighbourhood? Would a visit, sharing a word of God, a prayer or leading a religious person to them, be a form of spiritual healing to them? How exemplary is my prayer and Christian life? What is my response to the needs of the homeless, the displaced, poor and those grieving? Is my speech consoling and encouraging to those experiencing challenges or is it judgmental and disappointing? Let us not curse the darkness, but instead light even a small candle to dispel the darkness. All these will help our light to shine so that people may see our good deeds and glorify our Heavenly Father (Mt 5:16).
